WEEK 1 – ACTS 1

Theme: Waiting on God's Power

Day 1 – Acts 1:1-5

Insight: Luke emphasizes continuity between Jesus' ministry and the church's ministry. The empowerment of the Spirit is essential for the mission.

Question: Why does Jesus insist that the church cannot begin its mission without the Spirit?

Cross References: John 14:16-17; Luke 24:49

Day 2 – Acts 1:6-11

Insight: The disciples want a timetable; Jesus gives them a mission. His ascension establishes His reign and guarantees His return.

Question: In what ways do you struggle with wanting answers instead of obedience?

Cross References: Daniel 7:13-14; Matthew 28:18-20

Day 3 – Acts 1:12-14

Insight: The first church meeting was a prayer meeting. Waiting becomes fruitful when believers seek God together.

Question: What place does corporate prayer hold in your weekly rhythms?

Cross References: Psalm 27:14; Philippians 4:6-7

Day 4 – Acts 1:15-20

Insight: Peter interprets Judas' betrayal through Scripture, showing the early church read the Old Testament as pointing to Christ's work.

Question: How does Scripture help you interpret painful or confusing events?

Cross References: Psalm 41:9; Psalm 69:25

Day 5 – Acts 1:21-26

Insight: The apostles select Matthias through prayer and trust in God's sovereignty. Leadership decisions are spiritual decisions.

Question: What does this teach you about how the church should choose leaders today?

Cross References: Proverbs 3:5-6; 1 Timothy 3:1-7



WEEK 2 – ACTS 2

Theme: The Spirit-Filled Church

Day 1 – Acts 2:1–13

Insight: Pentecost reverses Babel; God unites people through the gospel. The Spirit empowers people for His purposes and not human-centered ambitions.

Question: What does Pentecost reveal about God's heart for the nations?

Cross References: Genesis 11:1–9; Joel 2:28–32

Day 2 – Acts 2:14–28

Insight: Peter interprets the event through Joel and the Psalms. The Spirit's work is rooted in God's promises and not human emotions.

Question: How does Scripture anchor your view of the Holy Spirit?

Cross References: Psalm 16:8–11; Romans 10:12–15

Day 3 – Acts 2:29–36

Insight: Peter centers his message on the resurrection and exaltation of Christ. Jesus is both Lord and Messiah.

Question: Why must every Gospel presentation center on the resurrection?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 15:3–8; Romans 1:3–4

Day 4 – Acts 2:37–41

Insight: Repentance and baptism mark the response to the Gospel. Salvation is personal but never private.

Question: What does repentance look like in your daily life?

Cross References: Luke 3:3; Acts 3:19

Day 5 – Acts 2:42–47

Insight: The early church devoted themselves to teaching, fellowship, generosity, and worship. These are the marks of a healthy church.

Question: Which of these four marks do you most need to grow in?

Cross References: Hebrews 10:24–25; Psalm 133:1



WEEK 3 – ACTS 3

Theme: A Church That Lifts the Broken

Day 1 – Acts 3:1–10

Insight: Peter offers the lame man something greater than money. He offers renewal in Christ. Miracles point to the greater healing found in salvation.

Question: What keeps you from offering Christ to people in need?

Cross References: Mark 2:1–12; Isaiah 35:5–6

Day 2 – Acts 3:11–16

Insight: Peter deflects credit and directs attention to Jesus. True ministry exalts Christ.

Question: Do you tend to take credit for spiritual impact?

Cross References: John 15:5; 2 Corinthians 4:5

Day 3 – Acts 3:17–21

Insight: Peter calls Israel to repentance so that "times of refreshing" may come. Repentance leads to renewal.

Question: What area of your life most needs refreshing from God?

Cross References: Isaiah 44:22; Matthew 11:28

Day 4 – Acts 3:22–26

Insight: Jesus is the promised Prophet like Moses who brings blessing to all nations. The story of Scripture points to Him.

Question: How does knowing Christ as the fulfillment of Scripture shape your faith?

Cross References: Deuteronomy 18:15–18; Galatians 3:8

Day 5 – Psalm 110 & Acts 3

Insight: Psalm 110 is the most quoted psalm in the New Testament because it reveals the kingship and priesthood of Christ.

Question: What does it mean for Jesus to rule as King today?

Cross References: Hebrews 1:13; Acts 2:34–35



WEEK 4 – ACTS 4

Theme: Courage Under Pressure

Day 1 – Acts 4:1–12

Insight: Peter courageously proclaims Christ to the very leaders who condemned Jesus. Salvation is found in Christ alone.

Question: Where do you need courage to speak boldly for Christ?

Cross References: John 14:6; Romans 1:16

Day 2 – Acts 4:13–22

Insight: The boldness of the apostles was rooted in the fact that they "had been with Jesus." Presence produces courage.

Question: How does time with Jesus shape your boldness?

Cross References: John 15:7; Psalm 27:1

Day 3 – Acts 4:23–31

Insight: The church doesn't pray for safety but for boldness and power. God answers with another filling of the Spirit.

Question: How might your prayers change as mission becomes your highest priority?

Cross References: Ephesians 6:19–20; 1 Thessalonians 2:2

Day 4 – Acts 4:32–35

Insight: Unity and generosity flow from the Spirit's work. The gospel reshapes our relationship to possessions.

Question: What does generosity reveal about your heart?

Cross References: 2 Corinthians 9:7–8; Deuteronomy 15:10

Day 5 – Acts 4:36–37

Insight: Barnabas becomes a model of encouragement and generosity. His life will shape Paul's ministry later.

Question: Who is someone you can encourage this week?

Cross References: Acts 11:22–24; Hebrews 3:13



WEEK 5 – ACTS 5

Theme: A Holy God in the House

Day 1 – Acts 5:1-11

Insight: Ananias and Sapphira's sin was not withholding money but lying to God. The early church learned that God protects His holiness.

Question: What does this story reveal about taking sin lightly?

Cross References: Leviticus 10:1-3; Hebrews 12:28-29

Day 2 – Acts 5:12-16

Insight: Signs and wonders confirmed the apostles' message, revealing Christ's continued work through His people.

Question: How do miracles function in the book of Acts?

Cross References: Mark 16:20; Acts 14:3

Day 3 – Acts 5:17-26

Insight: God sovereignly delivers His servants from prison to continue preaching. No earthly power can stop a Divine mission.

Question: How should God's sovereignty shape your boldness?

Cross References: Psalm 2:1-6; Acts 12:7-10

Day 4 – Acts 5:27-32

Insight: Peter refuses to obey man rather than God. Christian obedience remains anchored in God's authority.

Question: Where do you face pressure to compromise obedience?

Cross References: Daniel 3:16-18; Galatians 1:10

Day 5 – Acts 5:33-42

Insight: Gamaliel's counsel highlights the unstoppable nature of God's work. Believers rejoice in suffering for Christ's name.

Question: What does joyful suffering reveal about mature faith?

Cross References: Matthew 5:11-12; 1 Peter 4:12-14



WEEK 6 – ACTS 6

Theme: A Church That Solves Problems Biblically

Day 1 – Acts 6:1–4

Insight: The church grows so rapidly that structural problems emerge. The apostles prioritize prayer and the Word.

Question: How do you balance serving others with spiritual priorities?

Cross References: Exodus 18:17–23; 1 Timothy 4:13

Day 2 – Acts 6:5–7

Insight: Wise, Spirit-filled leadership brings unity and further growth. God uses people with humble character.

Question: Why does character matter more than giftedness?

Cross References: 1 Timothy 3:8–13; Proverbs 11:14

Day 3 – Acts 6:8–10

Insight: Stephen's wisdom and power came from the Spirit. His opponents could not refute the truth.

Question: How does the Spirit help believers defend their faith?

Cross References: Luke 21:15; 1 Peter 3:15

Day 4 – Acts 6:11–15

Insight: False accusations arise because Stephen embodies Christ. His face, "like an angel," reflects divine peace.

Question: How should believers respond when misunderstood?

Cross References: Matthew 5:43–48; 1 Peter 2:21–23

Day 5 – Acts 7:1–16

Insight: Stephen begins his defense by highlighting God's faithfulness to the patriarchs.

Question: Why does Stephen start with the story of Abraham?

Cross References: Genesis 12:1–3; Hebrews 11:8–16



WEEK 7 – ACTS 7 (CONTINUED)

Theme: A Faithful Witness Until Death

Day 1 – Acts 7:17–38

Insight: Stephen retells Moses' story to show that God raises deliverers whom Israel often misunderstands.

Question: How does Moses foreshadow Christ?

Cross References: Deuteronomy 18:15; Hebrews 3:1–6

Day 2 – Acts 7:39–50

Insight: Israel repeatedly rejects God's messengers, choosing idols over obedience.

Question: Where do you see patterns of resistance in yourself?

Cross References: Psalm 106:19–20; Romans 1:21–23

Day 3 – Acts 7:51–53

Insight: Stephen confronts Israel's leaders for resisting the Spirit and rejecting God's law.

Question: How does the Spirit reveal our own resistance?

Cross References: Isaiah 63:10; John 16:8

Day 4 – Acts 7:54–60

Insight: Stephen sees the glory of Christ and forgives his killers. His death mirrors Christ's death.

Question: What does Stephen teach us about suffering well?

Cross References: Luke 23:34, 46; Revelation 2:10

Day 5 – Acts 8:1–3

Insight: Stephen's death becomes the spark that scatters the church for mission. Saul approves the persecution.

Question: How does God bring good out of painful seasons?

Cross References: Genesis 50:20; Romans 8:28



WEEK 8 – ACTS 8

Theme: When God Pushes Us Outward

Day 1 – Acts 8:4-8

Insight: While persecution scatters believers, it also spreads the gospel. God uses hardship to move His people.

Question: How has God used a trial to redirect you?

Cross References: James 1:2-4; Acts 11:19

Day 2 – Acts 8:9-24

Insight: Simon seeks the power of the Spirit without repentance. His heart reveals the danger of false conversion.

Question: How do we discern genuine repentance today?

Cross References: 2 Corinthians 7:10; Matthew 7:15-23

Day 3 – Acts 8:25-29

Insight: Philip obeys the Spirit immediately, even without knowing the destination.

Question: Where is God calling you to obey without full clarity?

Cross References: Genesis 12:1; Psalm 119:105

Day 4 – Acts 8:30-35

Insight: Philip explains Isaiah 53, showing Jesus as the suffering servant who saves sinners.

Question: How confident are you in sharing Christ from Scripture?

Cross References: Isaiah 53; Luke 24:27

Day 5 – Acts 8:36-40

Insight: The Ethiopian responds with baptism and joy. The gospel crosses a major ethnic and geographical barrier.

Question: How does this story widen your view of God's mission?

Cross References: Psalm 68:31; Acts 1:8



WEEK 9 – ACTS 9

Theme: No One Is Beyond God's Reach

Day 1 – Acts 9:1–9

Insight: Saul is confronted by the risen Christ, revealing the seriousness of persecuting the church.

Question: What part of Saul's transformation encourages you most?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 15:8–10; Galatians 1:13–16

Day 2 – Acts 9:10–19

Insight: God calls Ananias to welcome the man he fears. Obedience can feel risky.

Question: Where is God calling you to show unexpected obedience?

Cross References: Jonah 1; Matthew 5:44

Day 3 – Acts 9:20–25

Insight: Saul immediately begins preaching Christ, provoking both interest and opposition.

Question: Why does obedience often lead to conflict?

Cross References: John 15:18–20; Acts 14:22

Day 4 – Acts 9:26–31

Insight: Barnabas bridges the gap for Saul, showing the importance of advocates in the church.

Question: Who has acted as a "Barnabas" in your life?

Cross References: Acts 4:36–37; Colossians 4:10

Day 5 – Acts 9:32–43

Insight: Peter continues Christ's healing ministry, demonstrating the living power of Jesus.

Question: What encouragement do these miracles bring to you today?

Cross References: Mark 5:35–43; Acts 3

WEEK 10 – ACTS 10

Theme: A Gospel Without Walls

Day 1 – Acts 10:1–8

Insight: Cornelius is devout but not yet saved. God is already working in him.

Question: Who in your life might be "almost there" spiritually?

Cross References: John 12:20–21; Acts 11:14

Day 2 – Acts 10:9–16

Insight: Peter's vision challenges deep-seated cultural and religious barriers.

Question: What barriers exist in your heart toward others?

Cross References: Ephesians 2:14–16; Mark 7:18–19

Day 3 – Acts 10:17–23

Insight: The Spirit orchestrates a meeting between Peter and Cornelius, revealing God's initiative in mission.

Question: Where do you see God arranging opportunities in your life?

Cross References: Proverbs 16:9; John 6:44

Day 4 – Acts 10:24–33

Insight: Cornelius gathers his household, showing the gospel's impact on families.

Question: Who are you praying for within your household?

Cross References: Joshua 24:15; Acts 16:31–32

Day 5 – Acts 10:34–48

Insight: Peter preaches Christ crucified and risen; the Spirit falls on Gentiles just as on Jews.

Question: How does this moment reshape your view of the global church?

Cross References: Romans 10:12–13; Revelation 7:9

WEEK 11 – ACTS 11

Theme: When God Moves, the Church Must Adjust

Day 1 – Acts 11:1–18

Insight: Peter recounts his experience, showing that Scripture and the Spirit agree.

Question: How do you confirm whether something is from God?

Cross References: 1 John 4:1; Acts 17:11

Day 2 – Acts 11:19–21

Insight: Scattered believers preach to new groups, leading to widespread growth.

Question: How can you speak naturally about Christ where God has placed you?

Cross References: Acts 8:4; Matthew 5:14–16

Day 3 – Acts 11:22–24

Insight: Barnabas strengthens the new believers with encouragement.

Question: Who needs your encouragement this week?

Cross References: Hebrews 10:24–25; 1 Thessalonians 5:11

Day 4 – Acts 11:25–26

Insight: The disciples are first called Christians in Antioch, where teaching and mission flourished.

Question: What does the name "Christian" mean to you?

Cross References: John 13:35; 1 Peter 4:16

Day 5 – Acts 11:27–30

Insight: Gentile Christians send aid to Judea, demonstrating unity and generosity.

Question: How does generosity reveal spiritual maturity?

Cross References: 2 Corinthians 8:1–5; Galatians 6:10



WEEK 12 – ACTS 12

Theme: God Rules Over Kings and Prisons

Day 1 – Acts 12:1–5

Insight: Herod flexes his political power, and the church responds with prayer.

Question: When facing threats, do you worry first or pray first?

Cross References: Psalm 2; Philippians 4:6

Day 2 – Acts 12:6–11

Insight: Peter is miraculously delivered, showing that God sends angels in moments of need.

Question: How does this event shape your view of God's intervention in your life?

Cross References: Psalm 34:7; Acts 5:19

Day 3 – Acts 12:12–17

Insight: The church is surprised when God answers their prayer. Even strong believers wrestle with doubt.

Question: When has God surprised you with His provision?

Cross References: Genesis 18:12–14; Mark 9:24

Day 4 – Acts 12:18–24

Insight: Herod is struck down for trying to steal God's glory. The Word continues to grow.

Question: What does this teach you about pride and God's sovereignty?

Cross References: Isaiah 42:8; James 4:6

Day 5 – Acts 12:25

Insight: Barnabas and Saul return to Antioch, preparing for the next major movement of Acts.

Question: What season of preparation might God be forming in you?

Cross References: Galatians 2:1; Acts 13:1



WEEK 13 – ACTS 13

Theme: Called and Sent

Day 1 – Acts 13:1-3

Insight: Mission begins in worship. The Spirit calls, and the church sends.

Question: What role does worship play in hearing God's call?

Cross References: Isaiah 6:1-8; Acts 1:8

Day 2 – Acts 13:4-12

Insight: Spiritual warfare accompanies mission. Elymas resists the gospel but cannot stop it.

Question: Where do you sense spiritual resistance in your life?

Cross References: Ephesians 6:12; 2 Corinthians 4:4

Day 3 – Acts 13:13-25

Insight: Paul traces Israel's story to Jesus, showing continuity between the Testaments.

Question: How does understanding the Old Testament deepen your faith?

Cross References: Psalm 2; Matthew 1:1-17

Day 4 – Acts 13:26-37

Insight: Paul proclaims the resurrection as God's decisive act of salvation.

Question: What difference does the resurrection make in your daily life?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 15:20-22; Romans 8:11

Day 5 – Acts 13:38-52

Insight: The gospel divides. Some accept it with joy while others reject it with hostility.

Question: How should you respond when people reject the gospel?

Cross References: John 6:66-69; Acts 28:24



WEEK 14 – ACTS 14

Theme: Perseverance in Mission

Day 1 – Acts 14:1-7

Insight: Paul persists despite divided responses. Fruit and conflict often go together.

Question: Where do you need perseverance in ministry?

Cross References: 2 Timothy 4:2; Acts 17:1-9

Day 2 – Acts 14:8-18

Insight: The people of Lystra try to worship Paul and Barnabas. They confront idolatry with humility.

Question: What modern idols must we confront with the gospel today?

Cross References: Exodus 20:3-5; 1 John 5:21

Day 3 – Acts 14:19-20

Insight: Paul is stoned but rises and continues preaching. God sustains His servants.

Question: What does Paul's resilience teach you about faith under pressure?

Cross References: 2 Corinthians 4:8-10; Romans 8:35-39

Day 4 – Acts 14:21-23

Insight: Paul strengthens disciples and appoints elders. The mission and discipleship go together.

Question: Why does leadership development matter for church health?

Cross References: Titus 1:5; 2 Timothy 2:2

Day 5 – Acts 14:24-28

Insight: The missionaries report back to Antioch, emphasizing that God opened doors of faith.

Question: What "open doors" has God given you this season?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 16:9; Revelation 3:8



WEEK 15 – ACTS 15

Theme: Protecting the Gospel

Day 1 – Acts 15:1–5

Insight: A dispute over circumcision threatens gospel unity. The early church faced doctrinal challenges immediately.

Question: How can sincere believers disagree and still protect unity?

Cross References: Galatians 2:1–5; Jude 3

Day 2 – Acts 15:6–11

Insight: Peter argues that salvation is through grace alone and not keeping the law.

Question: Why must any addition to the gospel be rejected?

Cross References: Ephesians 2:8–9; Romans 3:28

Day 3 – Acts 15:12–18

Insight: James quotes Amos, showing that Gentile inclusion fulfills prophecy.

Question: What does this teach us about God's long-term plan for the nations?

Cross References: Amos 9:11–12; Isaiah 49:6

Day 4 – Acts 15:19–29

Insight: The council preserves gospel freedom and gives guidelines for unity across cultures.

Question: How can you pursue unity without compromising truth?

Cross References: Romans 14:1–9; 1 Corinthians 8

Day 5 – Acts 15:30–41

Insight: Paul and Barnabas disagree sharply, but both remain committed to the mission.

Question: What can we learn from godly people handling conflict?

Cross References: 2 Timothy 4:11; Proverbs 27:17



WEEK 16 – ACTS 16

Theme: Unexpected Guidance

Day 1 – Acts 16:1–5

Insight: Paul circumcises Timothy for the sake of the mission, not for salvation.

Question: How flexible are you willing to be for the sake of others hearing the Gospel?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 9:19–23; Galatians 2:3

Day 2 – Acts 16:6–10

Insight: God closes good doors to open the right one. The Macedonian call redirects them to Europe.

Question: When has God guided you using a closed door?

Cross References: Proverbs 16:9; Revelation 3:7–8

Day 3 – Acts 16:11–15

Insight: Lydia becomes the first convert in Europe. God opens her heart to believe.

Question: How does God open hearts today?

Cross References: John 6:44; Ezekiel 36:26

Day 4 – Acts 16:16–24

Insight: Deliverance of a slave girl leads to suffering for Paul and Silas. The Mission involves spiritual conflict.

Question: Where do you sense spiritual opposition in your life?

Cross References: 1 Peter 5:8; Ephesians 6:10–12

Day 5 – Acts 16:25–40

Insight: Paul and Silas sing in prison, leading to a salvation story for an entire household.

Question: What does worship in suffering reveal to others?

Cross References: Psalm 42:8; Job 35:10



WEEK 17 – ACTS 17

Theme: Engaging a Skeptical World

Day 1 – Acts 17:1-9

Insight: The gospel challenges religious assumptions in Thessalonica.

Question: How does the gospel confront your own assumptions?

Cross References: Isaiah 55:8-9; Acts 14:22

Day 2 – Acts 17:10-15

Insight: The Bereans examine Scripture daily, balancing eagerness with discernment.

Question: How can you be more like the Bereans this week?

Cross References: Psalm 119:11; 1 Thessalonians 2:13

Day 3 – Acts 17:16-21

Insight: Paul feels grief over Athens' idolatry. Passion for God produces compassion for people.

Question: What breaks your heart spiritually in your community?

Cross References: Exodus 32:19; Matthew 9:36

Day 4 – Acts 17:22-29

Insight: Paul begins with cultural understanding before proclaiming Christ. He builds bridges without compromising truth.

Question: How can you build relational bridges for the gospel?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 9:22; Colossians 4:5-6

Day 5 – Acts 17:30-34

Insight: God commands all people to repent in light of the resurrection.

Question: How does the resurrection change the way you face life's uncertainties?

Cross References: Romans 10:9; 1 Peter 1:3



WEEK 18 – ACTS 18

Theme: Ordinary Faithfulness

Day 1 – Acts 18:1-4

Insight: Paul works as a tentmaker, reminding us that God uses normal work for ministry.

Question: How can your work become a platform for ministry?

Cross References: Colossians 3:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12

Day 2 – Acts 18:5-11

Insight: Christ appears to Paul in a vision, strengthening him with the promise of presence.

Question: When has God strengthened you during discouragement?

Cross References: Joshua 1:9; Isaiah 41:10

Day 3 – Acts 18:12-17

Insight: Gallio's judgment inadvertently protects Christian freedom.

Question: How does God sometimes use unbelievers for His purposes?

Cross References: Proverbs 21:1; Ezra 1:1

Day 4 – Acts 18:18-23

Insight: Paul continues strengthening churches. Making disciples includes both nurturing faith and evangelism.

Question: Who has God called you to strengthen this week?

Cross References: Hebrews 3:13; 2 Timothy 2:2

Day 5 – Acts 18:24-28

Insight: Apollos is eloquent but teachable; a rare combination.

Question: How teachable are you when corrected?

Cross References: Proverbs 9:8-9; James 1:19



WEEK 19 – ACTS 19

Theme: Power Encounters

Day 1 – Acts 19:1-7

Insight: Paul clarifies the Gospel for disciples in Ephesus. All knowledge must match the full truth of Christ.

Question: Where might you need deeper clarity in your faith?

Cross References: Acts 18:24–26; Romans 6:3–4

Day 2 – Acts 19:8-10

Insight: Paul teaches daily for two years, his longest recorded ministry in one place.

Question: What does this teach you about patience in discipleship?

Cross References: 2 Timothy 2:24–25; Deuteronomy 6:7

Day 3 – Acts 19:11-20

Insight: God works unusual miracles in a city full of occult activity. Many publicly confess and repent.

Question: What idols might God be calling you to surrender?

Cross References: 1 Thessalonians 1:9; Colossians 1:13

Day 4 – Acts 19:21-27

Insight: The gospel threatens the idol-making economy of Ephesus.

Question: How does following Christ challenge cultural idols today?

Cross References: Exodus 32; Matthew 6:24

Day 5 – Acts 19:28-41

Insight: The riot reveals spiritual and economic resistance to the Gospel.

Question: Where do you see resistance to Christ in your city?

Cross References: John 3:19–20; Acts 16:19



WEEK 20 – ACTS 20

Theme: Shepherding the Church

Day 1 – Acts 20:1-6

Insight: Paul strengthens believers through encouragement as he travels.

Question: Who has God placed in your path to encourage?

Cross References: Hebrews 10:24–25; Proverbs 12:25

Day 2 – Acts 20:7-12

Insight: Eutychus's being raised from the dead confirms the power of the Word and Spirit.

Question: What does this story teach about the seriousness of God's work?

Cross References: 2 Kings 4:32–37; Mark 5:35–43

Day 3 – Acts 20:13-24

Insight: Paul testifies that his life is worth nothing except fulfilling God's call.

Question: What part of Paul's example challenges you most?

Cross References: Acts 9:15–16; Philippians 1:21

Day 4 – Acts 20:25-31

Insight: Paul warns about false teachers and urges the elders to guard the flock.

Question: How do you guard yourself from false teaching?

Cross References: 2 Peter 2:1; Jude 4

Insight: Paul commends the elders to God's grace and leaves them in tears.

Question: What does this scene reveal about spiritual leadership?

Cross References: 1 Thessalonians 2:7–12; 1 Peter 5:1–4



WEEK 21 – ACTS 21

Theme: Obedience in the Face of Suffering

Day 1 – Acts 21:1–14

Insight: Repeated warnings show Paul what lies ahead. Faithful obedience leads him forward.

Question: When has obedience been costly for you?

Cross References: Luke 9:23; Acts 20:23–24

Day 2 – Acts 21:15–25

Insight: Paul submits to a purification ritual to avoid offending Jewish believers.

Question: How can you pursue peace without compromising truth?

Cross References: Romans 12:18; 1 Corinthians 9:20

Day 3 – Acts 21:26–30

Insight: Paul's actions are misunderstood, leading to mob violence.

Question: How does this passage help you face misunderstanding?

Cross References: Psalm 35:11; Matthew 5:11

Day 4 – Acts 21:31–36

Insight: Roman soldiers intervene, revealing God's providence through secular authority.

Question: How does God sometimes use unexpected people to protect His own?

Cross References: Ezra 1:1–4; Proverbs 21:1

Day 5 – Acts 21:37–40

Insight: Paul prepares to speak to the hostile crowd, demonstrating courage and clarity.

Question: Where do you need courage to use your voice?

Cross References: Jeremiah 1:7–8; Matthew 10:19–20



WEEK 22 – ACTS 22

Theme: A Testimony That Points to Christ

Day 1 – Acts 22:1-5

Insight: Paul begins with his background, showing respect and connection with his audience.

Question: How can your past open doors for the Gospel?

Cross References: 1 Timothy 1:12-17; Philippians 3:4-6

Day 2 – Acts 22:6-11

Insight: Paul recounts his encounter with the risen Christ.

Question: How has meeting Jesus changed your life direction?

Cross References: 2 Corinthians 5:17; Acts 9:3-6

Day 3 – Acts 22:12-16

Insight: Ananias affirms God's call on Paul and urges immediate obedience.

Question: What step of obedience is God prompting you to take today?

Cross References: Acts 26:16; James 1:22

Day 4 – Acts 22:17-21

Insight: God directs Paul to the Gentiles despite his own expectations.

Question: Where might God be redirecting you?

Cross References: Jonah 4; Acts 13:46-47

Day 5 – Acts 22:22-30

Insight: Paul's Roman citizenship protects him from unjust punishment.

Question: How should believers wisely use their rights today?

Cross References: Acts 16:37-39; Proverbs 22:3



WEEK 23 – ACTS 23

Theme: The Lord Stands By His Servant

Day 1 – Acts 23:1-5

Insight: Paul apologizes even when wronged, modeling humility and respect for authority.

Question: How does humility strengthen your witness?

Cross References: Proverbs 15:1; Matthew 5:39

Day 2 – Acts 23:6-10

Insight: Paul divides the Pharisees and Sadducees by highlighting the resurrection.

Question: How central is the resurrection in your daily hope?

Cross References: Romans 6:5; 1 Corinthians 15:19

Day 3 – Acts 23:11

Insight: Jesus appears to Paul, assuring him that his witness is not in vain.

Question: What promise from God strengthens you today?

Cross References: Joshua 1:9; 2 Corinthians 12:9

Day 4 – Acts 23:12-22

Insight: Forty men plot to kill Paul, but God exposes the plan through Paul's nephew.

Question: How have you seen God protect you unexpectedly?

Cross References: Psalm 91:11; Esther 6

Day 5 – Acts 23:23-35

Insight: Paul is transferred under heavy guard to Caesarea, revealing God's providential care.

Question: How does God's sovereignty give you peace in uncertainty?

Cross References: Romans 8:28; Proverbs 3:5-6



WEEK 24 – ACTS 24

Theme: A Gospel That Confronts the Conscience

Day 1 – Acts 24:1-9

Insight: Paul faces false accusations again, just as Jesus did.

Question: How do you respond when wrongly accused?

Cross References: Matthew 26:59; 1 Peter 2:23

Day 2 – Acts 24:10-16

Insight: Paul affirms his hope in the resurrection as the basis for present obedience.

Question: What does the resurrection require of you today?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 15:58; Colossians 3:1-4

Day 3 – Acts 24:17-21

Insight: Paul remains respectful even in trial, speaking truth without compromise.

Question: How can you speak truth with grace in difficult moments?

Cross References: Ephesians 4:15; Colossians 4:6

Day 4 – Acts 24:22-27

Insight: Felix is convicted by Paul's message but delays repentance.

Question: What spiritual decision are you tempted to delay?

Cross References: Hebrews 3:7-8; Proverbs 27:1

Day 5 – Acts 24 + Luke 12:47-48

Insight: God holds leaders accountable for what they know.

Question: How does knowing God's truth increase responsibility?

Cross References: James 4:17; Romans 2:4



WEEK 25 – ACTS 25

Theme: God's Purposes Through Human Systems

Day 1 – Acts 25:1–8

Insight: Paul's trials reveal both political pressure and God's orchestration.

Question: How do you see God at work even in flawed systems?

Cross References: Daniel 6; Romans 13:1

Day 2 – Acts 25:9–12

Insight: Paul appeals to Caesar, advancing God's plan for him to testify in Rome.

Question: What does this teach you about making wise decisions?

Cross References: Proverbs 16:3; Acts 23:11

Day 3 – Acts 25:13–22

Insight: Festus seeks help from Agrippa, showing the complexity of Paul's case.

Question: How can confusion in life still serve God's purposes?

Cross References: Acts 9:15; Psalm 37:23

Day 4 – Acts 25:23–27

Insight: The pomp of human authority contrasts with the humility of gospel truth.

Question: What does this teach you about true greatness?

Cross References: Matthew 20:26–28; 2 Corinthians 4:7

Day 5 – Psalm 2 + Acts 25

Insight: Earthly rulers plot in vain against God and His servant.

Question: How does Psalm 2 shape your confidence in troubled times?

Cross References: Acts 4:25–28; Isaiah 40:17



WEEK 26 – ACTS 26

Theme: The Gospel Demands a Response

Day 1 – Acts 26:1–11

Insight: Paul describes his zeal and violence before meeting Christ.

Question: How does remembering your past deepen gratitude?

Cross References: Ephesians 2:1–3; 1 Timothy 1:13–15

Day 2 – Acts 26:12–18

Insight: Jesus reveals Paul's mission to turn people from darkness to light.

Question: How does this calling encourage your own witness?

Cross References: John 1:5; Colossians 1:13–14

Day 3 – Acts 26:19–23

Insight: Paul's obedience flows from the reality of the resurrection.

Question: What step of obedience follows from your belief in the resurrection?

Cross References: 1 Corinthians 15:10; Acts 20:24

Day 4 – Acts 26:24–29

Insight: Agrippa is aware of what God has done, but not persuaded to believe. Proximity is not salvation.

Question: What keeps people "almost persuaded" today?

Cross References: Mark 10:21–22; Acts 24:25

Day 5 – Acts 26 + John 3:19–21

Insight: People resist the light not for lack of evidence, but because of love of sin.

Question: How does this passage sharpen your view of unbelief?

Cross References: Romans 1:18–25; 2 Corinthians 4:4



WEEK 27 – ACTS 27

Theme: Faith in the Storm

Day 1 – Acts 27:1–8

Insight: Paul's slow and difficult journey reflects the reality of Christian hardship.

Question: How do you respond when progress feels slow?

Cross References: James 1:2–4; Psalm 37:7

Day 2 – Acts 27:9–12

Insight: Human wisdom overrides spiritual insight, leading to danger.

Question: Where do you tend to trust intuition over God's direction?

Cross References: Proverbs 14:12; Isaiah 30:1–2

Day 3 – Acts 27:13–20

Insight: Storms expose our helplessness and deepen our dependence on God.

Question: How has a "storm" strengthened your faith?

Cross References: Psalm 107:25–27; Jonah 1

Day 4 – Acts 27:21–26

Insight: God promises to save all aboard because of Paul's presence. Believers bless others through their relationship with God.

Question: How is your presence a blessing to those around you?

Cross References: Genesis 39:5; Matthew 5:14–16

Day 5 – Acts 27:27–44

Insight: Paul's leadership in the storm points to God's sovereign care.

Question: What does this passage teach you about spiritual leadership in crisis?

Cross References: Psalm 23; Isaiah 43:2



WEEK 28 – ACTS 28

Theme: The Gospel Unhindered

Day 1 – Acts 28:1-10

Insight: God uses the detour to Malta for healing and ministry.

Question: How might a current "detour" be a mission opportunity for you?

Cross References: Genesis 50:20; Romans 8:28

Day 2 – Acts 28:11-16

Insight: Paul finally reaches Rome, showing that God accomplishes His purposes despite delays.

Question: How does this strengthen your trust in God's long-term plans?

Cross References: Acts 23:11; Proverbs 16:9

Day 3 – Acts 28:17-22

Insight: Paul begins ministry in Rome with the Jewish leaders, explaining the hope of Israel.

Question: How does the gospel fulfill God's promise to Israel?

Cross References: Romans 1:16; Luke 24:44

Day 4 – Acts 28:23-28

Insight: Some accept, and some reject. The gospel goes to the Gentiles.

Question: How do you respond to rejection in ministry?

Cross References: Isaiah 6:9-10; Romans 11:11-12

Day 5 – Acts 28:30-31

Insight: Acts ends "unhindered" to show that the mission continues through us.

Question: What role do you play in the ongoing story of Acts?

Cross References: Matthew 28:18-20; 2 Timothy 4:17
